Our Speaker this past week was Peter Castello of the Suntree Rotary Club. Peter came to talk about the Rotary World Peace District. The goal is to make District 6930 the first Rotary World Peace District.

The Mission statement reads: To create the 1st World Peace District in Rotary International, by having a least 75% of all district 6930 clubs successfully earn recognition as a "District 6930 World Peace Community" during the 2011 Rotary year, and for the District to recommend this project to Rotary International in Rotary year 2012.

Preamble

Recognizing the value of diversity within individual clubs, District 6930 leadership encourages clubs to access their club's peace consciousness activities in their community an to create/adopt significant peace projects either locally and/or internationally, that promote Rotary's concepts of peace consciousness, conflict resolution, or cultural understanding. The Initiative is non-denominational, non-political, and non-ethnic.

Project:

Step 1:

Your Club should form a District 6930 World Peace Community, with a chair (International Services Chair?). During the 2011 Rotary year, plan and implement at least two local and/or international projects based on: 1. World Peace Consciousness, 2. Conflict Resolution, and/or 3. Multicultural Understanding/Interaction.

Step 2: Complete and return the Rotary District World Peace Initiative Application.

Certification: Your Club will be listed as one of the original District 6930 World Peace Communities in the 1st World Peace District in Rotary International and a certificate will be presented to your club at the 2012 District Awards banquet.
