This week's program

Sentinels of Freedom

Dr. Kimberly Rogers, Principal of the Central Area Adult Education (CAAE) facility in Rockledge, was the Cocoa Rotary's guest speaker on Tuesday, January 20th. She has been at CAAE for 14 years, is a personal friend of Father Drew, and is also his boss!

Kimberly explained what type students were enrolled in the CAAE: students must be 16 years of age who have not experienced success in regular school. Some of their students may be 16 years old in the 7th grade. The CAAE also takes students who are not allowed in regular public schools: those who have committed felonies or who are on probation.

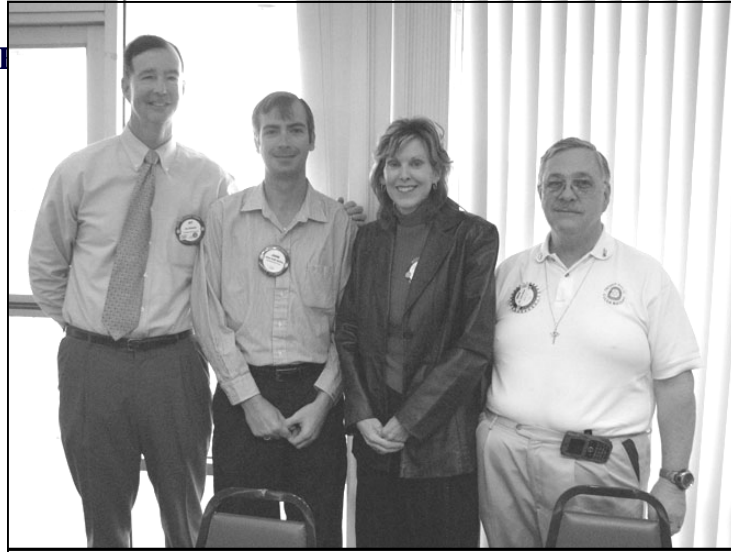
The CAAE also takes students from 16 to the 70s who never graduated high school and want a GED. The school basically runs four programs: 1 – for those wanting just a GED; 2 – for those wanting a high school diploma. These students must meet the same requirements as students at regular public high schools, including passing the FCAT. 3 – for ESOL (English Speakers of Other Languages) candidates who are students/people in the community who want to become English proficient; 4 – for co-enrolled high school students who attend regular high schools during the day and go to CAAE in the evenings.

Kimberly mentioned that the CAAE has numerous off-site programs on-going, as well as on-site programs, such as PROJECT SUCCESS for Exceptional Education students. These students' disabilities may vary from dyslexia to cerebral palsy to emotionally handicapped. Basically any type student – except educable mentally handicapped – is accepted.

CAAE also works with Cambridge and Endeavor Elementary with Zoo Explorers where students are sent to the zoo each week, and CAAE attempts to educate the children's families. Credit Recovery Labs are also run at area schools by the CAAE which basically pay teachers at area schools to teach for CAAE- saving time and money traveling to one site. Kimberly mentioned that the CAAE wants to start a Career Research Program to help students decide upon a career path once they finish school. Each semester, they may have as many as 400 students who come and go throughout the day and 250 to 300 students at night. They have a grant and are seeking mentors who will come out and talk about their professions. For more information, contact Father Drew Wales at 633-0788.
