This week's program

**Melissa Stains- President/CEO

Marie Venice, Victim/Witness Advocate for the State Attorney's Office (SAO), was the featured speaker for the Rotary Club of Cocoa's meeting on March 24, 2009. She is part of the 18th Judicial District which covers Brevard and Seminole County. Marie emphasized that she and her fellow workers are "advocates" – not counselors as they are often called. Their job is to walk through the criminal justice system with the victims - victims of sexual abuse, child abuse, and various felonies.

Marie views her job as one which give the victim back power over his or her own life. She noted that the law enforcement and the SAO, and the Judge could all be intrusive. Often the victim becomes provoked because the situation is taking too long to resolve.

She noted that Florida was the first state to pass an amendment to the Constitution which grants victims of crimes certain rights – "as long as it does not infringe on the rights of the accused."

This, Marie stated, was both good and bad. Civil and criminal law differ: with civil, all that can be taken away is money or property; with criminal, freedom, even life can be taken away. This explains the need to protect the criminally accused.

Marie also mentioned Teen Court where youthful offenders go before a team of people their own age who serve as attorneys and jurors, with someone from the SAO serving as the judge. If the defendant admits the violation, agrees to do what the "court" decides, and writes a letter of apology, the case is expunged.

Overall, the victim advocates follow through with the victims as long as the victims want them to do so; their purpose is to educate and walk the victims through the system. Volunteers who work with sexual assault victims are specially trained. There is also a Rape Crisis Center where all victims are taken; the volunteer advocates are on call 24/7 in Brevard County.

In closing, Marie noted that she has seen an increase in the severity of crimes in the last 12 years she's worked for the SAO. But, on a positive note, she related that the criminals do have to pay compensation for the victim's medical expenses, burial expenses, property loss, etc. up to 66%; most all providers accept this as payment in full. At least, it's good to know that the bad guys have to pay!
