# This week's program

Last weeks program was presented by Jim Underwood, President of the Merritt Island Breakfast Rotary Club. Jim spoke to us about a water safety program that the MI Breakfast Club initiated this year for local Kindergarten students. "Drowning is preventable so we need to bring awareness," said Jim "Unfortunately, Florida is the epicenter because of the number of pools, the number of ponds, the water is all around. Children are at risk."

During visits to Merritt Island's six public elementary schools, rotary club members handed out stickers and gave each student the book, "Josh the Baby Otter."

The book was written by Blake Collingsworth in honor of his son, Josh. The 2-year-old Nebraska boy died when he wandering outside his home during a family gathering and was found floating in the pool. He died a few days later. His parents started a memorial foundation and travel the country educating on drowning prevention. Underwood met the couple last year at a National Drowning Prevention conference and was immediately inspired by them.

His rotary club decided to spread the Collingsworth' message. They paid \$2,000 to get enough books to distribute to the Merritt Island public kindergartners. Students also got a coloring book and CD that has an audio reading of the book, a song and the pledge all the students took. The memorial fund supplied a costume of Josh the Otter so someone can play the character during school visits. When the furry, gray animal made his surprise appearance at Audubon Elementary, students reached out their hands for high-fives and hugs. They absorbed the message of staying safe near the water as they kept repeating the pledge.

Jim is encouraging our club to emulate this project in the Cocoa area.
