**This week's program**  
**Chief Joe Hellebrand**

Last weeks program was presented by Lisa Good with Brevard County Natural Resources.

The Natural Resources Management Office provides sound, cost effective management of environmental resources. This is accomplished by developing and implementing management plans, regulations, and educational programs which preserve and protect Brevard County's natural resources while still providing for their utilization by the public.

Brevard County encompasses approximately 1,500 square miles with most of the urbanized sections of the County located along the coast and barrier islands. Thousands of individual outfalls in Brevard County drain to either the Indian River Lagoon (IRL) or the St. Johns River (SJR). The IRL occupies the majority of central Brevard and includes the Indian River, Banana River and Mosquito Lagoon. Throughout Brevard, there are over 2,000 storm water outfalls, which convey untreated storm water into the Lagoon.

As part of the implementation of its growth management plan, local regulations were changed in 1978 to assure that all subdivisions and commercial sites developed within Brevard County were required to treat storm water runoff to reduce pollutants carried to surface waters and to store runoff volumes to reduce flooding of downstream properties. However, much of Brevard was developed prior to this time and had little or no storm water treatment facilities. To prevent flooding in these areas and address storm water-related pollution problems, additional measures were required. In September 1990, Brevard County adopted an ordinance that created a Storm water utility, thereby providing a dedicated source of funding for the storm water program.

To prevent the contamination of waterways avoid blowing lawn clippings into the street or dumping them down the storm drain. Once it rains, those leaves and grass clippings and yard waste are washed into the Indian River Lagoon. The nutrients contained in the waste cause algae blooms that decrease the amount of light and oxygen in the water and sometimes result in fish and sea grass kills.
