This week's program  
**Captain Ed Lanni**



Jennifer Hotsko, Rotary International Ambassador, Panama Canal Zone, was the featured speaker of the Rotary Club of Cocoa on Tuesday, April 21, 2009. She was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Suntree (Peter Costello) for this prestigious \$27,000 ambassadorial scholarship. In late 2005, she received the scholarship to attend the University of Cape Town, South Africa for the years 2007-2009 where she would study for a Master's of Philosophy in African Studies. The gap of time between graduating from the University of Florida and the beginning of her Master's was spent in Beijing, China teaching English to native Chinese. She is fluent in English, Spanish, and Italian and has a basic knowledge of Portuguese. What she added during this time were conversational skills in Mandarin Chinese. Jennifer can now converse with people from the largest emerging nation in the world.

While teaching in China, Jennifer took a trip to Tibet, starting in the south of China, proceeding to the Sichuan province and then flying to Lhasa, Tibet. Her plans were to travel to Mt. Everest's base camp. First she spent three days acclimating to the altitude, then a seven day trip to what she described as the coldest place she has ever been in her life, Everest base camp. Her descriptions and her photographs are wonderful. She lived in a tent and persevered because they were warmed in the tent by burning yak dung mixed with goat dung. It was an unbelievable life experience and an example for her of the extremes people will endure to achieve something they want.

When arriving in Cape Town, Jennifer's plans for study changed. She became aware of how stereotyped South Africa is with famine, war, etc., as seen in National Geographic and newspapers. One day she was on a bus on an Artscape when she conceived the idea of having the local high school students document their lives or show their worlds from their own eyes; it grew into a visual literacy program. Fourteen 10<sup>th</sup> graders were provided with cameras, and Jennifer taught them how to use the cameras, how to compose pictures, and how to work on a theme for their projects from transportation, food sales, pollution, and crime. Visual literacy included not only taking photos but also talking and writing about what was in the pictures. Her efforts concluded with an exhibit of the students' work at the Center for African Studies at the University of Cape Town.

Jennifer's next adventure is to take the foreign service exam in June and perhaps work with the United Nations in some capacity. Congratulations to her for what she has achieved to date in her exciting and rewarding life!
