In so many ways, YMCA Members and supporters are helping us achieve our mission of building strong kids, strong families and strong communities. And it starts with helping those families that need it most.

That means filling our Family Centers with positive role models (like you!), recruiting dedicated volunteers and helping to ensure that money never stands in the way of our welcoming anyone who wants to be a part of the YMCA. That's why donor support is so important. It is, in fact, probably the easiest way of connecting our Members with Our Mission.

It doesn't take much to do so much good. Whether you choose to help by volunteering your time or making a donation, you're helping us fulfill the Mission of the Y. Every dollar we raise ensures that every family that wants to be a Member can be, that any adult who needs a place to get healthy has it, and that every child has a place to learn to swim and the chance to attend summer camp.

The YMCA is all inclusive: They want to "Turn no one away" and to build healthy, spirits, minds, and bodies for all. The club has been in the US over 156 years, and is now 61% female. It was started by George Williams in 1844 in London, England, as a Bible study organization. It was the beginning of the Industrial Revolution and kids were in the streets. The YMCA started in the USA in Boston under Thomas Sullivan. The Y offered the first organized swim lessons and invented the games of basketball, volleyball, and racquet ball. Their programs teach positive values of respect, responsibility, honesty, caring, and faith.

Their motto is "Strong kids, strong family, strong community." The Brevard County YMCAs serve over 1,200 kids; last summer, 200 learned to swim. Also, 200 infants passed the "Safe Start" infant program – a program for those up to 18 months of age. This program resulted in 3 lives being saved last year. Also, over 100 kids went to day camp, 150 teens were involved, and 80 boys and girls were in the Explorer program.
