On April 28, 2009, Rotarian Brenda Fettrow was the featured speaker for the Rotary Club of Cocoa. Brenda was speaking on behalf of a newly formed coalition of concerned citizens who are undertaking **Project Hunger**. As we all know, times are tough and some families have to decide between paying the mortgage or buying groceries for the family. Based on a recent study, 6.6% of Brevard's population is food insecure; this equates to approximately 33,000 of our fellow citizens worrying about where their or their family's next meal is coming from. 2-1-2 Brevard is projecting to experience a 63% increase in requests for information about where to obtain food assistance when compared to requests from 2008.

A grassroots effort of concerned civic leaders to fill food pantry shelves in our community has begun. Simply put, they have come together and are reaching out to ask friends to provide monetary support to help fill pantry shelves. No one in our community should go hungry. 100% of the funds raised will go into a special account with the Second Harvest Food Bank of Brevard. This account will be used to stock our community's pantry shelves during the summer months. Due to the Second Harvest's buying power and influence as part of our nation's largest food bank, America's Second Harvest, they can generate \$9 in food for every \$1 that is donated.

For example, a \$100 investment has a return of \$900 which will feed the average family for six weeks – based on feeding a family of four at a retail cost of \$150 per week; \$250 will return \$2,250 and feed the average family for 15 weeks.

The United Way of Brevard has agreed to serve as administrator of the project's money at no cost. **Project Hunger's** goal is to raise \$100,000 by May 22 (schools are out on May 29). Your check to help can be made out to **PROJECT HUNGER**, or if you are a corporation, make the check out to the **United Way** and add **PROJECT HUNGER** in the notation area.
