Robert Foster with the Boy Scouts of America was our featured speaker for June 23rd, 2009. Robert stated that his first experience with the Boy Scouts was as a volunteer in college. Through his experience as a volunteer he recognized the importance of the Boy Scouts in regards to providing life experiences to inner city youth. After working as an accountant for a nationwide firm he realized that he wanted to do something that was more fulfilling. His journey to find that piece of mind led him to the Boy Scouts of America where he currently holds the title of District Executive with the Boys Scouts of America Central Florida Council . His duties include but are not limited to support, recruitment, and fundraising. His district covers nine counties in East Central Florida. He stated to us the importance of the program and surveyed that club to see how many members had actually been a member of the Boy Scouts in their life time. A majority of the club members had been.

Did you know that the Boy Scouts sell popcorn to raise funds? Each Scout has the opportunity to raise funds through this program. This helps pay for uniforms, badges, camping trips, and other scouting experiences. The Scout retains 65% of all funds raised. This is a great benefit for those who simply can not afford the cost but still want to participate.

The Boy Scouts also help in the community. On the first Saturday of November they will be hosting their annual "Scouting for Food" food drive. This food drive provides tons of food to local food pantries which in turn gives it to individuals and families in need. David Brubaker, Vice President of the Central Brevard Sharing Center, stated that it is the biggest food drive of the year.

Robert closed by asking for volunteer support. Volunteers are utilized in many ways and are key for the Boy Scouts to continue their mission to positively influence boys in our community as they grow to be young men.
