On July 7, the last day of President Jay Schenk's year, the new District Governor, Leo H. Phillips, Jr., the new Assistant DG, Fred Bailey, and the new District Governor Elect Louis Venuti were guests of the Rotary Club of Cocoa. DG Leo came to deliver the message from the new RI President, John Kenny, with John's goals for this Rotary year.

POLIO

Leo mentioned many places and amounts of money raised to combat polio: 90 million from Rotarians, 56 million from Canada, 100 million from Europe, 100 million pounds from the UK, etc. Rotarians have been challenged to raise another 100 million by 2012. The District is shooting for \$50,000, with \$1,000 from each club. Remember: it only costs 60 cents per immunization.

Rotary FOUNDATION

The Foundation funds such events as the GSE, Ambassadorial Scholarship, District Projects, and more. Fifty percent comes back to the district in three years. Points (1,000) are awarded to each person who contributes \$1,000, and this counts towards becoming a Paul Harris Society Member in the District; currently, there are 35 such persons in our District who donate \$1,000 each year to the Foundation.

MATCHING GRANTS from RI

This money has dropped from 18 million to 9.5 for the current year, and the money may be gone by August. Grant applications should be made ASAP.

MEMBERSHIP

Needless to say, we need to recruit new members and retain what we currently have. In North America, 18% of Rotarians are women; in Korea, 20% are women. All clubs need to attract younger members, as well as more women. The District is looking for each club to increase its membership by one, retain current members, increase the number of women in the club, membership of those under age 50, diversity of membership, and Rotary Foundation membership.

LITERACY

Currently, 800 million people in the world cannot read and write. Sixty-four percent of those are women and girls.

WATER

Over one billion (1.1) people lack access to clean water. There are 2.6 billion without basic sanitation facilities; each eight seconds, a child dies from not having access to clean water; over 6,000 deaths occur daily for the same reason.

HEALTH & HUNGER

AIDS and malaria are two of the major targets; six million people die each year as a result of these diseases, with millions of those deaths to kids under the age of five. Malnourished people number 850 million.

GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE

Due to economic reasons, the duration of these visits is reduced to four weeks.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE

There is the need to go back to basics. The District is conducting various events to ensure this. The most important message from RI President Kenny is this: **"The future of Rotary is in your hands."**
