On September 1, 2009 our guest speaker was Wendell Watson, Executive Director of the Space Coast Marine Institute.

The Space Coast Marine Institute is a non-profit residential facility located in Melbourne, Florida, that serves as an alternative to prison for juvenile offenders ages 14-18 from throughout the state of Florida. SCMI provides a cost-effective second chance for kids who would otherwise be sent to jail for their offenses.

The boys have committed an average of 4 to 12 offenses by the time they are referred to SCMI by the Department of Juvenile Justice. Our students arrive with little or no self-esteem and have experienced minimal positive interaction with adults and peers.

Mr. Watson stated they provide structure, supervision, consistency, caring and love that a successful family provides. Participants work within a behavior modification system based on points earned for both performance and behavior. Academic work is supported by our unique adventure based curriculum, which challenges every youth to reach for success. The program includes seamanship, landscaping, the Ropes Challenge Course and environmental awareness.

The formula for success is proven by our 70% success rate, nearly double the national average among residential programs for juveniles.

Associated Marine Institutes, including the Space Coast Marine Institute, were founded on the principal that the environment is one of the best rehabilitative tools available.

In Brevard County we are privileged to be surrounded by marine habitats and natural waterways. The students of SCMI participate regularly in the Seamanship Program under the supervision of our on-staff Captain. Students engage in educational programs on the shoreline and spend time at sea aboard our 24-foot vessel the "MISSION POSSIBLE". Students have the opportunity to earn their boaters license as well as participate in community service projects that help to clean up and preserve the Florida coastline.
