Dr. R. Duff Sprawls with the Space Coast Cancer Center was our guest speaker for September 23, 2009. Dr. R. Duff Sprawls graduated from the University of Louisville School of Medicine. He completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at the University of South Florida, and he completed his Medical Oncology Fellowship at the University of South Florida, H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center. Dr. Sprawls is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Medical Oncology. He is a member of the American College of Physicians, the Brevard County Medical Society, the Florida Medical Association, the American Society of Clinical Oncology, and the American Society of Internal Medicine.

Dr. Sprawls spoke to us about cancer and some of the advancement that have been made over the past few years. He mentioned that only five types of cancers can be detected through tests. They are Cervical, Breast, Prostrate, Skin, and Colon Cancer. All other cancers are not recognized until symptoms occur. He stated how important it is to get screened for these cancers on a yearly basis. Especially if you are over 50 years of age. Most cancers can be cured if they are detected at an early stage. So screening for these tests can save lives.

He stated that hundreds of millions of dollars are spent each year researching a cure to cancer. However in the next 10 years the cure rate will only increase by 6%.

We've all been affected by cancer in our lives. Whether its someone in our immediate family, a friend, or co-worker we've all seen how cancer can take its toll. That's why it's so important to support cancer research. One way of supporting cancer research is by participating in the Relay for Life.
