VOCATIONAL PLAQUE

Rick Lovell, Commander of the Naval Ordnance Test Unit (NOTU), delivered a command presentation to the Rotary Club of Cocoa on December 16, 2008. The NOTU is housed at the Cape Canaveral Air Force Station with 840 people: military, government, service, and contractors. Its mission is to flight test ballistic missiles. Rick displayed some charts on a PowerPoint that recorded the different types of missiles over the years, including the Polaris, the Poseidon, and Trident. He explained that the Atlantic Flight Test Program flies missiles down range, and with today's technology, they are able to tell where the missile will land: its latitude and longitude. They have had 124 straight successful launches. Before missiles are launched from submarines, they are first launched from a pad. Also, extremely stringent tests are conducted on each missile. Missile technicians are trained inside a real missile minus the warhead. When work is needed on the West Coast, the team of 50 missile technicians is broken into different teams for flight purposes. Rick ended by mentioning that 24/7, the United States has ballistic missiles on submarines in both the Atlantic and the Pacific Oceans with one or more on alter status. In the 1960's to 1980's, there were 41 ballistic missile submarines.
