The Rotary Club of Cocoa was pleased to welcome Carol DeGarmo with Big Brothers/Big Sisters (BBBSCFL) as speaker for the day on October 7, 2008. With Carol was Molly Lovan, Brevard County staff member. BBBSCFL was established in 1904. The area Carol represents is over a five county area that includes Brevard. Central Brevard has had BIG for 34 years. Their mission is to improve the lives of children ages six to 18 through professionally supported one-to-one mentoring relationships with measurable impact. BBBSCFL is committed to recruiting quality volunteer mentors to serve as change agents in the lives of children in need. It is estimated that nearly 20% of youth under the age of 18 in Central Florida is considered to be at-risk. BBBSCFL plans to meet the needs of these youth. With an ambitious growth agenda, BBBSCFL intends to double the number of children served by 2007 and increase its level of service each year thereafter. A mentor allows youth to dream and achieve beyond their environment and expectations. A consistent relationship with a professionally supported adult mentor ((BBBSC) helps youth develop and reach their highest potential.

The Rotary Club of Cocoa was also honored to have District Gov. Betsy Owen as a guest. She explained that when the ROTARY INTERNATIONAL President Dong Kurn Lee was looking for a theme, he was made aware that 30,000 kids between 1 and 5 years of age die each day of preventable diseases. Thus, he charged the individual districts with finding a project in their areas that would address decreasing the number of childhood deaths. Betsy found that DROWNING is our number one problem, so we are encouraged to come up with a local, state, or national project to address childhood drowning.

DG Betsy also mentioned that President Dong Kurn Lee's main three interests are polio, membership, and the Foundation. For polio, he wants each club to raise \$1,000 each year for three years but wants to do it in ONE year to replace the 100 million grant from the Bill and Melinda Gates that will be spent by 12/08. The new goal is to eradicate polio by 2010. For membership, he wants a net gain of 10% in membership by May 1, and for the Foundation, the districts want \$400,000 by June 30 – money which is used for internal and/or simplified grants BACK to our district.

In addition to the Big Brothers/Big Sisters and Dist. Gov. Betsy, Nicole Woxber, a Cocoa High School parent and Chuck Goldfarb, Cocoa High School Athletic Director, were in attendance to receive a check for \$4,000 from the Cocoa Rotary to be used for purchasing new attire for the wrestlers at the high school. They both expressed sincere appreciation for the donation, and the Club was extremely pleased that they could help. *Article courtesy of Linda Krupp.*
