Doug Parker provided the Club with a big over-view of what Crosswinds Youth Services, Inc.(CYS) really does for the young people it serves. Since 1974, CYS has taken care of thousands of kids.

Some of these support and services Include:

- 24 hours per day, 7 days per week supervised shelter and care for young people ages 10-17
- Comprehensive assessments for youth and families
- Individual, group, and family counseling services
- Case management services
- Educational, vocational, and recreational services designed to strengthen skills for success

According to Doug, children coming to the shelter are lacking in academic preparedness (usually two years behind) and are not communicating with adults. CYS tries to break the cycle of how these kids think of themselves, first with a human counselor; secondly, with a trained PAWS Therapy Dog Program. CYS does what it needs to do to help the children.

One of every 10 families in Brevard County has been touched by CYS. The average age of the child being served is 15, with around 4,000 boys and girls being helped each year. Everything is free to the child and family. This year, the Cocoa Rotary contributed \$1,500 to the cause. Good for us!
