This week's program

Colonel Jeffrey L. Macrander of the 920th Operation Group Commander, Air Force Reserve, 920th Rescue Wing, Patrick AFB was the Rotary Club of Cocoa's featured speaker on July 1, 2008. He shared with the Club his role in rescuing a Navy Seal from behind enemy lines in Afghanistan – a very remote, poor, and agricultural country. The area was all “grey:” no paved roads – desert one way, mountains another. The challenge was op-

erating a helicopter in the 13,000' mountains.

Col. Macrander stated that he was in Qandahar on June 28, watching the news and heard that a special operation's helicopter had been shot down, killing all 16 people aboard. When the phone rang on June 30, he received the word to leave on what would be a 2 ½ hour flight in a significant dust storm. He and his team think they are going to rescue the 16 bodies from the helicopter crash. On the contrary, they were headed into the Afghanistan Mountains to rescue four men from a downed Navy Seal team.

They searched and searched but only got “clicks” when they called the men on their radios. They left the safe compound; their escort had to go get gas, while they went to several points of interest and landed on June 30.

While they were sleeping, an Afghanistan national came into a military compound. This person related that a Seal had wandered into his village. He wanted the US patrol to come get the man from his compound which was quite a distance away. Bad weather did not help the situation. A ground vehicle would have to drive four hours to get there. So, it was planned that Col. Macrander's crew would land in the village at night and get the man.

The area where they had to land was about the size of the helicopter. When they landed, two men jumped out. One of them was the Navy Seal – the lone survivor who was also the medic; the other Afghanistan man would not let go, so both were thrown into the helicopter. The Navy Seal, Marcus Luttrell, was debriefed; he related that all of the Seals had been injured. They found two bodies; Lt. Michal Murphy was recently posthumously given an award for calling for help.

On July 4th during the rescue, US planes were less than ¼ mile away firing at the Taliban. Col. Macrander's men were dealing with steep terrain, so they had to dump 200 pounds of supplies, including seats, from the helicopter. They were able to retrieve the bodies which they delivered to the rest of the Seal team, friends, and families. On July 9th, Colonel Jeffrey L. Macrander handed off their mission to another group which was successful in retrieving the last soldier's body.

Col. Macrander stated that the rescue guys completed 120 rescues in 400 hours and asked that we keep them in our prayers. The Club acknowledged this request with a standing ovation for the troops and Col. Macrander.
